# School is among magazine's best in the nation

Mayfield High School earned a bronze medal in the U.S. News & World Report's list of Best High Schools in the country, but nearby Richmond Heights and Brush high schools did not make the list.

Mayfield received the bronze designation for "high-performing schools based on state exam performance," the same designation it received in 2014. The school did not make the numerically ranked list.

The news organization teamed with research firm RTI International to survey about 20,000 high schools in the United States on seniors' math and reading proficiency test scores, college readiness, student-to-teacher ratio and more during the 2012-13 school year.

Mayfield was one of 3,990 high schools nationwide to receive bronze medals. About 97 percent of Mayfield High School seniors are proficient in reading and 96 percent are proficient in math, according to the U.S. News & World Report.

"We feel that this is an honor and recognition for our entire school system," communications director Laurie Uhlir said. "It is a direct reflection of our teachers, staff, parents and community support."

## Area Memorial Day events

The following are some of the events commemorating Memorial Day that are taking place in The News-Herald's coverage. The events are on May 25 unless otherwise noted.

### Lake County

- Concord Township will host a ceremony from noon to 12:30 p.m. at Concord Cemetery on state Route 608.

- Eastlake VFW Post 3863 and Willowick American Legion Post 678 will host a ceremony at 10 a.m. at Willowick City Hall and at 11 a.m. at the Boulevard of 500 Flags in Eastlake. Both ceremonies are open to the public.

The parade will step off at 1 p.m. from Rice Elementary School, 7640 Lake Shore Blvd., travel east on Lake Shore Boulevard to Andrews Road, turning north. The parade will end at Mentor Beach Park where festivities will continue with speakers, food and refreshments.

- The City of Wickliffe will hold its parade at 10 a.m. Hosted by the American Legion, it steps off at Euclid Avenue and Worden Road and continues west to Bishop Road and ends at Wickliffe City Hall, with a memorial service on the front lawn of City Hall.

- Willoughby will hold a parade at 9:30 a.m. It will start in downtown Willoughby, travel to Park Avenue and then to Willoughby Cemetery. Ceremonies will be held immediately following the parade and will take place. Ceremonies will take place rain or shine.

- A ceremony will take place at 11 a.m. at the Veterans Memorial, 35400 Chardon Road in Willoughby Hills. A full memorial ceremony will be held with Lake County Commissioner Kevin Malecek as the master of ceremonies. In the event of inclement weather, the ceremony will be held in the community center.

### Geauga County

- The Geauga County Histori-

cal Society will host a Civil War Encampment on Memorial Day Weekend, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. May 23-24 at Century Village Museum in Burton Village.

Commemorating the 150th anniversary of the last year of the Civil War, it will provide a living history of struggles and tribulations associated with the Great War of the Rebellion. Cost for adults will be \$7 for adults, \$4 for children from 6 to 10, and free for children 5 and under.
