GOALS AND OBJECTIVES





Parkview Pool

Parkview Pool offers a variety of programs for toddlers through Seniors. The facility is outstanding with lanes for lap swimming, learn to swim, open swim or competitive activities and open swimming. The facility also includes a separate competitive diving well (12'8" deep), a corkscrew waterslide, a 0-42-inch depth play area with a variety of water toys, a concession stand, men's and women's locker rooms and shade structures.



Parkview Softball Complex & Soccer Fields

The Parkview Softball Complex is located at 425 North Commons Blvd. and includes three softball diamonds and two large soccer fields plus three mini fields. For more information contact the Recreation Department at 440.461.5163.

The Grove

The Grove is our newest Amphitheatre/green space in the heart of Mayfield Village's Greenway Corridor. Located on 3 acres just north of Parkview Pool, with easy access to the Greenway Trail System, the Wetlands, the new Library, the North Chagrin Reservation, and Mayfield Village's softball and soccer fields, The Grove is surrounded by trees creating a secluded commons in the center of our Village park System.

Parkview Playground

Located at 425 North Commons Blvd., boasts a large toddler/youth playground that includes state-of-the-art playground equipment, a sandbox, a rubberized play surface, and a pavilion that is available for rental by school district residents. Wiley Park

Located at 610 SOM Center Road offers a volleyball court and bocce court. Wiley Park also has a pavilion with a wood-burning fireplace that is available for rent. Firewood is provided with the rental of the pavilion. For rental information contact the Recreation Department at 440.461.5163.

The Bruce G. Rinker Greenway

Greenways are corridors of protected open space managed for conservation and recreational purposes. Trails are paths used for walking, bicycling and other forms of recreation.

Parkview Tennis and Pickle Ball Courts

The Mayfield Village Recreation Department has 3 tennis courts with one lined for Pickle Ball. These courts have lights and are located at the Parkview Recreation Area located off of S.O.M. Parkview Playground

Parkview Playground is over 20 years old and has served the community. Moving forward, the proposed playground will be fully inclusive (See page 20), include an outdoor exercise area for adults, and serve a larger portion of the population. A grant was filed and approved through ODNR Nature Works Program in the amount of \$150,000 to assist in funding the playground. A second grant through Land and Water will be submitted in November for additional funding. The project budget is set at \$500,000 and is scheduled pending approval for 2020.

Softball Field Renovations

In 2020, the two large softball fields will be renovated at the Parkview Softball Complex. The fields will be relevelled along with a top dressing being applied. The fields will also have grass areas added to help provide material run-off.


Storage Units

Two storage units will be added to the Parkview Recreation Area. The first will replace the old shed, and the Pod Storage unit which will primarily be used by the Service Department to house equipment and supplies needed to maintain the Softball Fields, Bocce and Tennis Courts. The second unit, will be constructed for the Parkview Pool which will include the equipment needed for the boating instruction program.
